THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR A

My brothers and sisters in the Lord,

The first reading describes the region of Galilee as a place of darkness and foretells that the people of this region will see a great light. Capernaum was located on the "way of the sea", a commercial route far away from the purity of the observance of the Jewish Law. There would have been a lot of ambivalence and paganism in this cosmopolitan atmosphere. Jesus could have begun his mission in a much "holier" place. He could have called his first disciples while they were praying in the Synagogue. But he chose to begin in this confused and uncertain situation. The message of this Gospel is that Jesus comes looking for us no matter how distant we are from him. He calls us where we are now, in the tangled mess of our lives, and invites us to a new way of living.

His appearance in Galilee is only the beginning of a mission in which Jesus will enter into the most profound darkness of humanity. Jesus will descend into the death of man and take him by the hand and call him forth. Do not look at your own bad situation and wonder if you are worthy of being called or not! Look at the one who is calling you, right now, today! Do not look at your own capacities, but look at his power! He is the one who knows how to transform the darkness of our lives into the light of life.
