TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: YEAR B World Mission Day

My dear brothers and sisters,

Weakness, infirmity, drinking the cup of the Lord—the readings today point us to the necessity of accepting all of the difficulties in our lives in union with Jesus Himself.

The first reading today is from the Prophet Isaiah and tells us that the Lord was pleased to crush him in infirmity. This is a reference to the Suffering Servant. The Suffering Servant in Isaiah is a figure of a person who was willing to sacrifice all for others. This becomes an image of Jesus. For us, it always poses the question: How much am I will to suffer for others? Jesus was willing to sacrifice all. What I am willing to sacrifice?

The Gospel from Mark today gives us this wonderful passage about James and John. They want to sit beside Jesus in the Kingdom. Jesus is clear that this is a gift that he cannot give but Jesus immediately used the question as a teaching: whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. So again we are left with a question directed to us: Am I willing to be servant and slave of all? If I want to follow Christ in the Kingdom, then I must be willing to accept this role of servant and slave to all! I might reply: I don't want to be important in the Kingdom, I only want to be in the Kingdom! It does not matter. If we want to be in the Kingdom, we must learn to serve, whether we want to be great or small! We are invited to follow Jesus Christ. Let us walk with Him and learn with Him to accept suffering and even death so that we may be with Him in the Kingdom forever.

Pope Francis invites us at the conclusion of the Rosary with that most ancient invocation to the Holy Mother of God, "Sub Tuum Praesidium" as well as the traditional prayer to St. Michael ascribed to Pope Leo the XIII. With this invitation, Pope Francis gives us a key to interpreting the current situation: the spiritual combat. It may be good to make known chapter V of Gaudete et Exsultate, on "spiritual combat, vigilance and discernment". There will be an opportunity for us to pray the Rosary as a Parish Community on **Sunday 28th October at 5.00pm.** Please do try and come along.
