16th February 2020 SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

My dear brothers and sisters,

Matthew continues the Sermon on the Mount with a three part instruction by Jesus on the Way of Life in the kingdom of heaven. Today's reading is part one and deals with the Law. Part two deals with worship and religious practice and contains the Lord's Prayer. Part three deals with trusting God and deeds of loving service to our neighbour. When Matthew speaks of "the Law and the prophets" he means the whole Scripture. When the Messiah brings the fullness of the kingdom none of scripture will be done away with. Instead it will be fulfilled. Matthew's Jesus does not overturn the Law of Moses, nor does he set his followers free from the Law. He requires his followers to go beyond the Law by doing more than the Law requires.

As Jewish Christians who had always been faithful to the Law Matthew's community need a way to understand the difference Jesus and the kingdom he brings have made. They affirmed that God had always been at work in history through "the Law and the prophets." But God's work goes beyond that to be embodied by the Messiah who reveals the definitive will of God. The written scriptures and their interpretation in tradition are surpassed by Jesus whose life and teaching are the definitive revelation of the will of God.

NEW GLAZING TO CHURCH ROOF and 14 months of leaks: The new glazing on the church roof was completed around December 2018 with the final of six payments being made in that month. However, we have kept back a retention fee of £3,800 as well as having the guarantee. Just as well. As you know, the new glazing has been leaking ever since. The leaks have been reported on a frequent basis and various remedies have been tried, some helping a little but the leaks have kept coming. On Thursday 6th February, Ryan, our building surveyor, managed to have a meeting on the roof with Nick from KJW, the main contractor, and representatives of the glazing company which had actually designed, manufactured and installed the new glazing frames and glass. After much resistance and some very robust talk, the glaziers finally removed the flashing above the area that had the most leaks and found that many of the seals that should have been installed had been left out! Thankfully, the glaziers immediately admitted responsibility. They then promised that they would return within two weeks to make sure that all the seals were in place across the whole of the glazing. Progress! We now have hope that the drips will come to an end....
